- Most people defining blogs use terms such as diary or journal, reflecting the personal nature of the early weblogs.
- According to Webster's New Millennium Dictionary of English, "a blog is an online diary, a personal chronological log of thoughts published on a web page; also called a weblog, We blog" (Webster 2007)
- "It is a Web application that contains periodic, reverse chronologically ordered posts on a common webpage"(Wikipedia 2011)

Objective of Study:

- 1) To find out the international library blog : providing library services
- 2) To describe the steps for building library blog using “Blogger” platform

Scope/ Limitation:

- The study is restricted to the library blogs – providing library and information services and the 30 international university library blogs, chosen from Times Higher education Ranking 2011.
- Researcher only collects the library services data from each international university library blog.

Library Blog: to Promote Library services:

To promote library services, resources, and programs online can be a lot calmer with the assistance of a blog. A Blog can be very effective tool for reaching online audiences. (Carmella, 2009) An inordinate library blog requires three elements: inspiration, motivation, and dedication. Inspiration is when anyone gets a new idea that tangles perfectly with a blog as the carriage. Motivation is the energy to put good ideas into practice and helps launch the new Blog. Dedication is what comes next. It is the hard work that keeps the Blog updated with pithy, lively posts constantly. (Fichter, 2003)

Library Professional should create a blog that promotes library events programs and give freedom to users or visitors to put their thought on selected topics. A blog can reach out beyond the visitors to a regular website. Blogger needs to set up RSS Feed and alert everyone for participating in posting their headlines on websites or use RSS newsreader to see what is up at the library. Researcher prepared a prototype blog taking into mind all the features of 'blog', prototype library blog is made on 'blogger' platform. The prototype library blog displayed some features of the Blog. Further, the step-by-step path finder made by library professionals, researchers, or people interested in becoming bloggers can move forward.

Blogging host / Software / Platforms / Content Management System:

Several blogging tools enable users to create their online environment and online identity easily. These tools may be free or paid also. Free blogging tools offer users instant communication power by giving them the chance to post their thoughts whenever they want. Blogging software and tools have a unique mechanism to disable the facility of allowing the user to post comments on messages. After posting the message, it gets the permanent link, and then they move from the front page to the archive, and any time accessible through the permalinks.

On the home page of the blog, on sidebars blogger can place critical information and additional links, e.g., a short link introduction of the blog, a link to personal information of the blogger, a blogroll, a list of authors, like RSS, lists of noteworthy sites other than blogs, links and short summaries of blog posts it is called syndication. (Bar-Ilan, 2007)

Some of the websites maintained by the blogs software companies provide lists of the weblogs that have been created using their software. A distinguishing feature of blogging software is the facility to automatically archive entries, allowing posting to be searched, browsed, and retrieved. (Reichardt, R)

Blogging became popular due to the development of many simple, out-of-the-box products that allow for a blog's uncomplicated creation and maintenance. Blogging software provides the author with an easy-to-use graphical interface for posting to the weblogs. Most of the interfaces resemble the screen of a primary word processor, as on clicking formatting commands to change the look of an entry or insert the hyperlinked into a sentence. Once typed, the content of the post or entry is on one-click 'to post,' and the time of posting or entry is automatically added to both the web page and archive.

Customization of blogging software permits one author or many authors to post entries with permission settings that can restrict blog members' editing, creating, or deleting powers.(Reichardt & Harder, 2005) The significant thing about blog software is that it adapts to the blogger's needs, schedule, and ease. Blogger: Blogging Platform

‘Blogger’ was launched in August 1999 by Pyra Labs, and very soon, it was popularized as one of the blog publishing tools. Google purchased Pyra Labs in February 2003. A part of the blogger redesigns on 9 May, 2004, and 2006 and including web standards-compliant templates, individual archive pages for posts, comments, and e-mail posting. (Wikipedia, 2021a)

Blogger is one of the oldest free blog sites, though its popularity has dipped recently. Blogger is a free service to set blogs. 'Blogger' is very easy to use and provides comments, customizable templates, archives, search capabilities, and an automatic RSS feed that allows users of blog aggregators such as Blog lines to 'Subscribe 'to a blog. When it is subscribed, the user can log in to the aggregator and view new posts and entries. In blogger, customized templates allow one to choose a look appropriate to one's subject areas. (Ryan & Panki, 2006)

There are some Pros – free to use, and set up takes only a few minutes. Mobile optimized temples are available; in blogger hosting, maintenance and other technicalities are taken care of by hosting. The blogger is well integrated with Google. The blogger can make use of the tracking and anti-comment spam. There are some Cons also – In the blogger, there is no way to additional features, designs options are very few, and the blogger can advertise on the blog. The blogger is entirely free, but we have to pay for that when we want to use a custom domain. (Nick Schaferhoff, 2020)

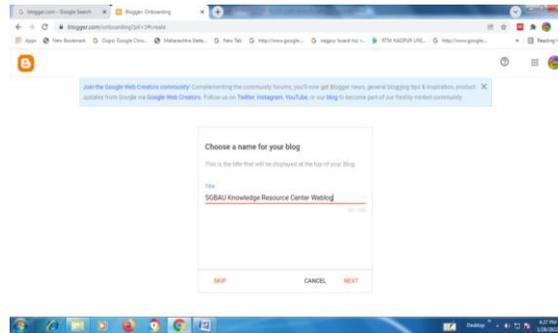
STEPS FOR CREATING A WEBLOG

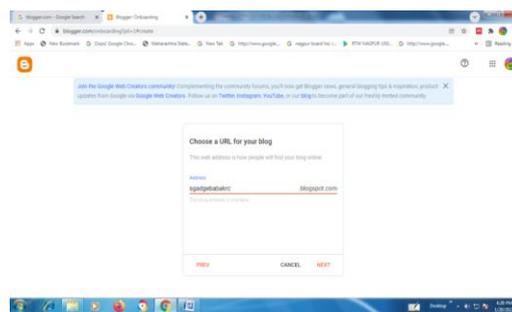

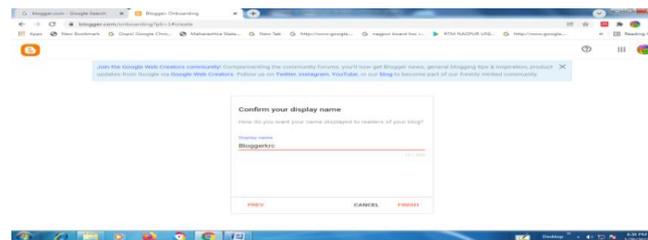

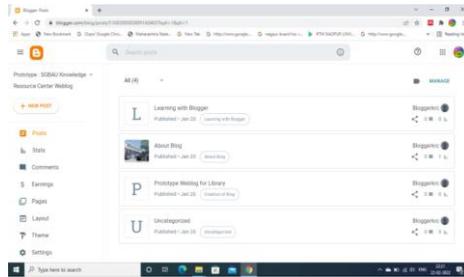

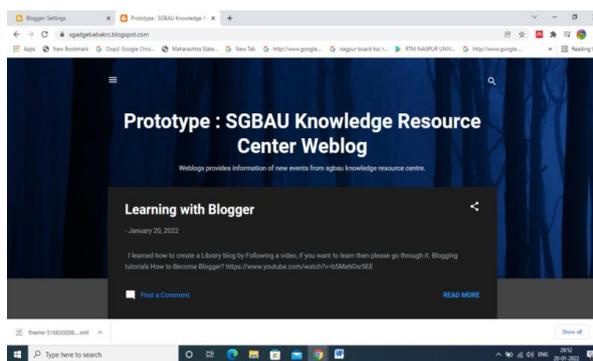


Screenshot No. 5: Blog created

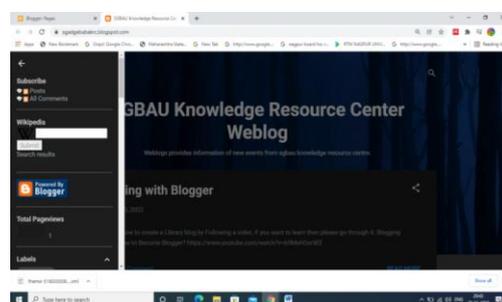
Screenshot No. 6 : Display of Blog before Published

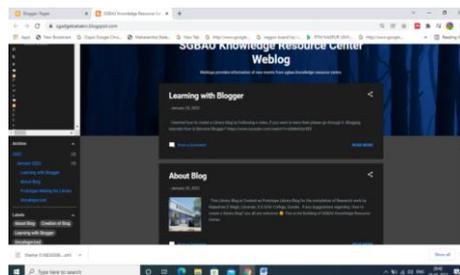
